Michigan residents can shoot fireworks from June 29 to July 5 this year under new law

The new laws also added additional regulations for fireworks retailers, as well as giving the governor, Department of Natural Resources, the state fire marshal and local fire departments the authority to impose no-burning restrictions if there are environmental concerns.

See the full list of dates and times for allowable consumer fireworks use statewide below. Check with your local municipality to determine whether consumer fireworks are allowed at other times of the year.

- Dec. 31 until 1 a.m. on Jan. 1.
- Saturday and Sunday of Memorial Day weekend until 11:45 p.m.
- June 29 to July 4, and July 5 if the date falls on a Friday or Saturday, until 11:45 p.m.
- Saturday and Sunday of Labor Day weekend until 11:45 p.m.
